

Examinations for the courses are held after the completion of lectures each academic semester and last for two (2) weeks. The evaluation method and grading for each course are the exclusive responsibility of the instructors and are conducted independently of other courses, based on an objective assessment of the student's performance in that specific course.

The evaluation criteria are clearly defined and stated in the information sheet for each course. A student is considered to have successfully completed a course and earned the corresponding ECTS credits if they receive a grade of five (5.0) or higher. The grading scale ranges from zero (0.0) to ten (10.0). A student must retake a course if they receive a grade lower than five (5.0).

The results of the examinations are submitted by the instructors to the Secretariat no later than two (2) weeks after the examination of the course. The grades for each course are reported with one decimal precision. Students enroll in three (3) compulsory courses and two (2) elective courses in the first academic semester and in three (3) compulsory courses and two (2) elective courses in the second academic semester.

Students who fail a course in the first semester must re-enroll in the second semester, with the obligation to retake the exam for that course during the upcoming September examination period. If they fail again, they are considered to have not successfully completed the JPP. Students who fail more than one course in the first semester are considered to have not successfully completed the JPP. Students who fail a course in the second semester must retake the exam for that course during the upcoming September examination period.

If they fail again, they are considered to have not successfully completed the JPP. Students who fail more than one course in the second semester are considered to have not successfully completed the JPP. In cases where a student has not successfully completed the JPP, the Program Committee of the JPP may recommend to the Steering Committee either the permanent dismissal of the student from the JPP or the re-enrollment of the student in the program. Permanent dismissal from the JPP entails the loss of student status.
