

ERM302 Master Thesis

The Master’s Thesis is an independent research study conducted during the 3rd semester of the program. It aims to develop a rigorous, original, and methodologically sound investigation of a topic relevant to the field of study. The thesis must be 15,000–20,000 words in length and is completed under the supervision of a faculty member.

Upon successful completion of the thesis, students will be able to formulate and apply an appropriate research methodology, theoretically and empirically analyze a complex academic problem, produce an original scientific contribution, prepare a well-structured academic document with proper referencing and bibliography, and present and defend their research findings effectively.

Assessment

The evaluation of the Master’s Thesis is based on the originality and overall quality of the research, the degree of methodological rigor demonstrated, the clarity, coherence, and completeness of the written document, the student’s adherence to established academic standards, and the effectiveness of the final presentation and oral defense.

Explicitly defined assessment criteria are accessible to students in the regulations of the Joint Postgraduate Program (Article 15).
